## West County Wastewater Crews Complete Repair in the Castro Ranch Area of Richmond

(RICHMOND, CA) On the evening of Wednesday, July 26, 2023, at 8:10 p.m., repairs to a broken sewer pipe were completed at the Carriage Hills Pump Station on Castro Ranch Road in Richmond.

Initially, West County Wastewater (WCW) crews arrived at the area at approximately 8:15 a.m., Wednesday, July 26, 2023, after being alerted to a broken sewer main. Trucks were on-hand to pump the contents of the sewer main while the pipe was dug up and repaired.

After repairs were completed today, the pipe was tested, retested, and is now back in service. The entire force main is scheduled for replacement.

WCW staff will continue to monitor the pipe and the lift station in this area.
