West County Wastewater Crews Contain Sewer Overflow in the Castro Ranch Area of Richmond

(**RICHMOND, CA**) West County Wastewater's (WCW) Collection System crews first became aware of an emergency occurring at the Carriage Hills Pump Station on Castro Ranch Road, about 150 yards south of Conestoga Way in Richmond, at approximately 8:15 a.m., Wednesday, July 26, 2023.

WCW crews arrived on the scene at approximately 9:00 a.m. to contain the spill and put out emergency signage in the area after ordering trucks to the site.

A report was made at approximately 10:00 a.m. to the California Office of Emergency Services.

This is a sewer overflow, and estimated 15,600 gallons of sewage overflowed, and a small portion was not recovered and entered Castro Creek.

WCW will continue to provide updates on the progress of the repairs.
